





They'll support you by assigning you suitable work, helping you build relationships across the business, providing technical experience and development and goal-making advice, signing timesheets, and answering any questions you have along the way.

You'll also be supported by a Program Manager. They'll help with allocating you

to suitable teams for your placements, setting up mock-interviews, and supporting you when you're applying for ongoing roles towards the end of your program. They'll also be there to answer any program related questions, offer coaching support and advice and check in regularly to see how you're going.

Both your Placement Manager and Program Manager work together to provide you with a positive program experience.




